<u>Compulsory</u> REVISION comments	<p>Prior to its publication, the prose presented in the essay needs to be revised with respect to its grammar, punctuation, and other similar "technical" matters. Throughout the essay are instances of incorrect punctuation (e.g. "physician's" [singular possessive] when it should be "physicians'" [plural possessive]), poor/problematic word choice, unclear phrasing, and inconsistent presentation (e.g. a term presented in a non-hyphenated form in one instance, and in a hyphenated form in another instance), for example. I would suggest that the aforementioned issues/problems can be easily rectified if the essay is proof-read by a native-English speaker with an appropriate level of academic training (i.e. a completed graduate degree).</p>
