<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) <b>In the title: please consider adding “: a case-report” after the word “craving”.</b></li> <li>2) <b>The abstract is too concise and does include not even a single mention to method nor a very concise quantitative synthesis in the results section. It looks like a narrative “highlight” section rather than a scientific journal abstract.</b></li> <li>3) <b>The introduction is misplaced and it would also request a very robust editing: that paragraph should rather provide a concise, yet punctually referenced synthesis of the available literature and rational background for the present study. Moreover, the bottom sentence should nonetheless clearly state the goal of the present case-report study. I would recommend something like this (please extend and provide a punctual referencing nonetheless):</b>“a) One or two sentences about the worldwide prevalence of methamphetamine dependency and craving worldwide (references needed). B) an additional sentence about the available literature concerning buprenorphine vs. bupropion response for methamphetamine dependency (if any data ever available so far; referencing is needed). C) The section about the lack of information on the matter in Iran is important, as it may represent the most</li> </ol>	



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	<p><b>innovative information from this single case report. D) Conclude the introduction by better clarify that the goal of the present study is to present a case-report of an Iranian patient.</b></p> <p><b>4) About “case-presentation”: please consider using the present tense. The passage “in short” is not adequate to a medical report... Also, additional information about the psychiatric history and reason for medical consultation should be requested.</b></p> <p><b>5) Discussion is too concise. I would also recommend emphasize that the use of methamphetamine in Iran is something that was not already documented elsewhere and that the even the local clinicians should therefore prompt their own attention toward an early proper recognition of those cases who should present with suggestive, yet still locally uncommon, clinical pictures.</b></p>	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments		
<b>Optional/General</b> comments	<p>A very robust revision of the editing of the structure of the manuscript is needed. If done, the present submission should be better re-considered as a letter to the Editor given the lack of tables, figures, and accurate information about the case. That would be the only editorial circumstance to support such a concise style of reporting.</p>
